## Presidents' Message - March 2009

The start of this year has been marked by a very busy time for the ADEE. As you will see from the reports of the various activities elsewhere in the newsletter. On a chilly early spring day in Amsterdam we held one of our regular Executive meetings. There were a number of important items on the agenda of which I would like to highlight just a couple.

Firstly, one must mention the excellent work undertaken by an ADEE Task Force under the leadership of Damien Walmsley. The task of this group was to review, update and rewrite the original Task Force I document: 'Profile and Competence for the European Dentist' – now renamed: 'Profile and Competences for the Graduating European Dentist'. This is a significant document which has been the subject of wide and in-depth consultation via the dental schools and professional bodies throughout Europe.

The many comments submitted have been most helpful in the development of the consensus document and as President I would like to thank on behalf of the ADEE, the writing group and also the dental professional and academic community in Europe who have significantly contributed to this outstanding piece of work. Further, the document makes a clear statement of the commitment of the ADEE to maintain the previous work of DentEd III and to keep the original consensus DentEd reports as 'living' useful reference documents. In a not dissimilar vein, as President, I would also like to compliment Nikos Mattheos and Anders Nattestad on the report that has stemmed from the Implant Teaching Workshop that they organized in Prague in 2008. This is already published on the website and even before full publication in the journal in February had received extensive and very complimentary comments from the educational community. Obviously, this work naturally links to 'Profile and Competencies' and I am excited to see that already other 'specialist' areas of dental education are planning to undertake similar exercises under the ADEE umbrella. Thus the impact and importance of this initiative, led by Nikos and Anders, goes far beyond the area of dental implantology.

While in Amsterdam the Executive had the opportunity to see something of the facilities that will be used to host the 2010 ADEE 36 meeting. If all goes according to plan, a new dental school should be finished which will house much of the meeting. The meeting theme will cover the area of impacts of the digital world on dental education – and, thus far, the organization for the event looks excellent and the speakers which have been proposed should offer a significant insight into this topic. During our visit we were also able to view the impressive next generation of clinical dental simulators that have been prepared for the pre-clinical training area in the new school.

Of course I can't mention an annual ADEE meeting without reminding you all of the 2009 ADEE 35 event to be held in Helsinki in the last week of August. Arrangements are well in

hand the theme is 'Lifelong Learning & Continuing Dental Education'. This is an important topic at this particular time so I expect the meeting will be well attended. Please access the Registration site from the homepage of [www.adee.org](http://www.adee.org) - and notice that when you Google 'ADEE' we are now at the top of the list!

After the work in Amsterdam the Executive attended the first ever ADEE event to be held in the European Parliament in Brussels. The evening was co-hosted by ADEE and Dr. Milan Gal'a MEP. The 'headline' was the 10th anniversary celebration of DentEd - an important event to commemorate, however it also gave the opportunity to speak with key policy makers and MEP's in the European Union about all matters related to dental education. And the very significant contribution of the ADEE and DentEd to this area.

Following a welcome from Dr. Gal'a three short presentations were given; as President I provided an overview of the history, role and purpose of the ADEE whilst highlighting our main areas of success and the challenges/opportunities ahead. Our main message is that ADEE will continue to both raise and assure the quality of dental education in the EU and thus raise the quality of oral and dental care for the citizens of the EU and Europe as a whole.

The second speaker was Derry Shanley who had the original idea, vision and drive to develop the DentEd projects. He spoke of the objectives of the DentEd Thematic Network: To create a network of EU dental educators; Share innovation and best practice; Converge towards higher standards; Agree educational objectives and outcomes; Agree core clinical competences; Promote international peer review; Prepare the way for EU accreditation. Of particular impact on the many attendees at the evening was the European map, with which many of you will be familiar, which shows DentEd membership in 1999 and the extensive engagement across the continent in these projects

Lastly, Fons Plasschaert, the man who delivered DentEd III to successful fruition last year, spoke about the work of the six Taskforces, the impact of the work on educators across the EU and EHEA and the very significant amount of publications in refereed international journals that resulted. All speakers referred to the progression of the European work to have global impact and particularly the success of the Global Congress held in Dublin in 2007. We also clearly stated the intention of the ADEE to maintain and build on the work of the three EU Thematic Network projects. My impression of the event was that we have made an important first step in speaking to the policy makers in the EU whilst making them aware of the work that the ADEE has achieved, in partnership with DentEd, over the last decade. The important task of delivering the ADEE's strategy of communication, on your behalf, will continue. I am modelling the recently commissioned ADEE chain of office – with what I hope is a suitably serious expression on my face! ### Secretary General's Report

The last number of months have been relatively quiet as there have been no major events or structural changes, nor have any site visits been made. Most activities which were undertaken during this time were related to Brussels' liaisons, preparation for the launching event, collaborative work on the Task Force I document and preparations for applications related to EU subsidies.

We have had extensive exchanges with our consultancy agent in Brussels, Hill & Knowlton, initiated and maintained by several Executive members, the ADEE Office and by our newly appointed EU Coordinator, Professor Alfons Plasschaert. It has resulted in an official reception, hosted by Dr Milan Gal'a, an MEP from Slovakia, and a dentist by profession. H&K has invited him to act for the coming years as ADEE's Champion in Brussels. This means that we should maintain regular contact with Dr Gal'a - with the EU Coordinator in particular having responsibility for this task.

Dr. Argyro Kavadella, together with Professor Jonathan Cowpe, and assisted by Professor Alfons Plasschaert, have been very active in preparing an application for EU Erasmus, and

bilateral programmes for lifelong learning. However, due to insufficient preparation time, it was decided that submission of the application would be postponed until next year.

The call for proposals relating to applications for cooperation with Third World countries, has been postponed by the European Union, however we are expecting the imminent realization of this project as well.

Our report on ADEE's site visit to Dar-es-Salaam was completed and submitted to the school in October of last year, and we are now awaiting its approval by the University of Dar-es-Salaam.

Members of the Taskforce I team under the eminently capable leadership of Professor Damien Walmsley have been very active in revising the Profile and Competences document. The revised document is in its completion stages and will be proposed for acceptance at the next ADEE General Assembly.

The Implantology Symposium was completed very recently and was great success, with the publishing of the proceedings in February as a special supplement of the Journal. We would like to take this opportunity to offer our sincere gratitude to all participants, especially those that were active in the preparations, for this momentous event - above all Nikos Mattheos, who did an exemplary job.

I recently, had a meeting with members of the Executive Board of ORCA, the European Organization for Caries Research. ORCA is interested in developing a cariology curriculum in the manner and after the model of our 'Profile and Competence' document and under the auspices of ADEE. We envisage that this process may more or less resemble that which accompanied the Implantology Symposium. Such a development would be in line with ADEE's vision for the future and mirrors the shape of things to come.

## ADEE School visit to Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania *Argyro Kavadella, member of the visiting team*

At the invitation of the Dean of the School, Dr. Emil Kikwilu, an ADEE team visited the School of Dentistry of the Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences, Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania, in October, 2008. The visit was sponsored by the Finnish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and organized by the Helsinki University Institute of Dentistry and Finnish Dental Association through KIOH (Kuopio International Oral Health). The purpose of the visit was to identify and share innovations and best practices; promote greater exchange of ideas, staff and students; promote the pooling of intellectual resources in dental education; and to break down barriers. The Five-Year Strategic Rolling Plan (Year 2006/07 to 2010/11) prepared by the school provided the basis for discussion. The visitors were Malcolm Jones (Chair, Wales, UK); Henk Kersten (Rapporteur, Amsterdam, Netherlands); Heikki Murtomaa and Juha Ruotoistenmaki (Helsinki, Finland); and Argyro Kavadella (Athens, Greece).

The Dental School is one of the five schools constituting the Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences. It was established jointly in 1979 by the Tanzanian Ministry of Health and the University of Dar-es-Salaam and supported by donor assistance and partnership arrangements with European countries (mainly Finland and the Netherlands). Partner schools in Europe assisted in providing teaching material, dental equipment, short and long term lecturers, scholarships and scientific cooperation. The first school director was Dr Clement Luhanga. The mission is to educate suitably trained Tanzanian dentists to address the oral health needs of the country. Its objectives, as presented by the Planning Committee of the University are: to train undergraduates in all aspects of dentistry; to provide dental care to patients in Dar-es-Salaam city and surrounding districts; to function as a research centre undertaking and monitoring epidemiological studies in dentistry; to cooperate with the Ministry of Health in the training of dental auxiliary staff. To date, the School of Dentistry remains the only institution in Tanzania where dental education at the degree level is offered. The School of Dentistry is also one of two World Health Organization Collaborating Centers in Sub-Saharan Africa.

The school is housed in a purpose-built three-storey building, presently in great need of refurbishment. It has four clinics with a total capacity of 40 dental units, with potential for installing 8 additional units. There is a pre-clinical room (phantom room) with 25 working units, a dental laboratory with 13 working benches; a plaster room, a casting room; and 3 offices. The building has three lecture rooms (40 seats each) a lecture theatre (140 seats), a conference room (20 seats), 2 clinic side rooms (10 seats each); and 20 office spaces. Books and journals in the small library are mostly old and outdated due to the cost of replacement. Although the room has Internet access, there is only one computer for Internet research. There are other computer facilities in the main University building but dental students have difficulty accessing the immense knowledge resources available via the Internet. In summary, the building provides adequate space for optimum use as a dental school. Primary among the difficulties faced is the acquisition of new equipment. The school needs to find ways of replacing the old dental equipment and increasing the number of computers provided for Internet use. It is clear that in the absence of air conditioning, schools in the tropics will find that the life span of dental equipment is much shorter than is usual.

The School has three Departments, namely: (1) Oral Surgery & Oral Pathology, with three units (oral surgery, oral medicine and oral pathology); (2) Preventive & Community Dentistry, which has three units (preventive & community dentistry paedodontics and orthodontics, and (3) Restorative

Dentistry, with four units (restorative/operative dentistry, prosthodontics, dental biomaterials and periodontology).

In late 2006 the school had 150 students - 40 DDS I, 24 DDS II, 30 DDS III, 36 DDS IV and 20 DDS V. In December 2006 there were 10 administrative, and 16 academic, members of staff (10 male and 6 female); three of them are on PhD training, and one on a Masters of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. By academic rank - there are 2 associate professors, 4 senior lecturers, 7 lecturers, and 3 assistant lecturers.

The School offers a ten-semester DDS degree programme, with 20 examinable subjects, which are taught at a maximum of two examinable subjects per semester. Basic science subjects are taught over two and a half years of the DDS program in the Schools of Medicine, Public Health and Social Sciences. The programme is community-oriented: students are exposed to various Tanzanian communities through fieldwork and family case-studies. In this way, students learn how to address the oral health problems of people within their locale, with a strong bias towards prevention and health promotion.

The School has four registered postgraduate programmes (MDent) and Ph.Ds. The MDent programmes cover four specialties: Oral Surgery, Oral Pathology, Restorative Dentistry and Community Dentistry, and have recently been semesterised to improve viability. The enrolment to these programmes is still quite low. Only MDent Oral Surgery has been running uninterrupted for the last four years. The goal is to enrol at least two students into each programme each year. Since its establishment in 1978, the School has trained PhD students under a 'sandwich programme' with the Universities of Kuopio, Finland and Nijmegen, the Netherlands. The process of teaching, research and patient & community services is driven by democratic process through the School Board (which oversees the activities of the School), and the Dental Building Clinical Services Committee that constitute MNH heads of firm and School of Dentistry heads of department. Three committees assist the School Board namely: Year Conveners', Research & Publications and Curriculum Development committees.

### 1<sup>st</sup> European Consensus Workshop on Implant Dentistry University Education Special Issue of the European Journal of Dental Education

The Special Issue of the *European Journal of Dent Education* containing the papers from the **1st Consensus Workshop on Implant Dentistry University Education** has now been printed and distributed. Work on the editing process lasted over several months, as all papers were peer-reviewed, which resulted in long correspondence in some cases. The process was successfully completed within reasonable time. The electronic version of the publications is now also available. Hard copies of the special issue were distributed to the 100 academic participants; 300 copies distributed between the 6 sponsors of the workshop; and approximately another 500 to current Journal subscribers. Publication of the Special Issue concludes the project of the consensus workshop.

In accordance with the commitment of the ADEE Executive Committee to maintain this network, a Special Interest Group for Implant Dentistry Education was initiated during ADEE's annual meeting in Zagreb. An on-line platform has been established to support the activity of the SIG at [www.dentalimplanteducation.net](http://www.dentalimplanteducation.net) and the platform is active and currently accepting registrations. Approximately 40 participants have already registered and with the publication and circulation of the Special Issue of the journal the site will host a standing discussion on the produced guidelines in addition to acting as a peer support network for the implementation of Implant Dentistry in the dental curricula. The network will convene physically every year during the ADEE congress and will in due time (estimated at 2012) organise the 2nd Consensus Workshop.


