The project aims to provide primary care to the isolated populations of the Ladakh area of Kashmir and to educate the local population in oral health. In particular the Project aims to train the Ladakhi Amchis (nuns who tend to the spiritual and medical needs of the local population).

The DentCPD project is nearing the end of its two year term of funding. The outputs have been impressive and ADEE wishes to thank those individuals and institutions who have contributed to its success. The outcome of the project will be of benefit to all dental schools in Europe.

ADEE has continued to carry out visitations to dental schools and earlier this year undertook a visit to Ege University in Izmir, Turkey. I wish to thank the school in Izmir, Turkey and the visit team led by Heikki Murtomaa. These visitations are important to the remit of the organisation and we have several more at the planning stages. ADEE-CED collaboration: meeting in Brussels

The joint ADEE-CED (Council of European Dentists) Taskforce, established to develop a common proposal to the evaluation of the Professional Qualifications Directive (PQD) met in Brussels in July. ADEE was represented by the President Cecilia Christersson, Past-President Winfried Harzer and the Treasurer Argyro Kavadella; CED participants included Dr. Constantine Oulis, Dr Peter Engel, Dr. Manuel Bravo and Policy Officer Mrs. Sara Roda. Task Force members discussed the Commission’s proposal to amend Directive 2005/36/EC on the recognition of professional qualifications relating to the minimum training requirements for dental practitioners.

Members agreed to propose a joint amendment to Article 34 paragraph 2 of the PQD, as follows: *“Basic dental training shall comprise a total of at least five years, which may also be expressed with the equivalent of 300 ECTS credits, and shall consist of at least 5000 hours of full-time theoretical and practical study, comprising at least the programme described in Annex V, point 5.3.1 and given in a university, in a higher institute providing training recognised as being of an equivalent level or under the supervision of a university”*. A joint letter of statement was drafted in this regard - undersigned by the Presidents of the two organisations - which will be used during the course of the legislative procedure.

The Joint Taskforce members agreed to continue their collaboration to develop a joint proposal for the amendment of the Annex V, point 5.3.1 (Study programme for dental practitioners). The joint proposal aims to replace the list of subjects (which currently express the proficiency of the graduating dentist) with a competence-based study programme, as described in the ADEE’s paper *“ Profile and competences for graduating European Dentists - update 2009”*, combined with CED’s paper *“CED resolution on competences required for the practice of dentistry in the European Union - May 2009”*.

Taskforce Members exchanged opinions on the structure and content of the proposed Annex and following further work will meet in October to discuss progress.

ADEE Participates in First European Oral Health Summit in Brussels

European Parliament, the Commission and the European Council Presidency. Members of the European Parliament, the European Commission and the Council of Europe, National Chief Dental officers, representatives of European Organisations and Oral Health Associations, Dental Practitioners’ Organisations and key opinion leaders will be amongst the participants.

Session Topics will be:

- Session 1: The state of oral health in Europe
- Session 2: What the EU can do to improve citizen’s oral health
