Dental – Medical interface: New developments in the Medical curriculum at the University of Bern, Switzerland

The medical curriculum at the University of Bern, Switzerland, has been expanded with contents specifically associated with oral health related general medical care. These included 1) the anatomy of the oral cavity; 2) the oral pathology which is affecting general health or the systemic diseases affecting oral health, respectively; 3) the therapeutic measures provided by both physicians and dentists to improve the patients' general and oral health.

Beginning in the pre-clinical second year of medical education, the medical students are given one informative lecture on the anatomy of the oral cavity. Clinical pictures of the oral cavity are shown to demonstrate the healthy oral mucosa (including norm variations), the healthy periodontium, and the healthy dentition (including the dental nomenclature).

In the following third year (first clinical year), the medical students are given one lecture on the relationships of periodontal diseases and diabetes. The aim of this lecture is to demonstrate the relationship between both diseases leading to an increased understanding for the necessary collaboration between both physicians and dentists with all diabetes and periodontal patients.

The fifth year of the medical curriculum includes two lectures given by both a dentist and a physician. In these lectures, the students are taught the following relationships between oral and general health: 1) patients diagnosed with diabetes and periodontal diseases; 2) patients treated with bis-phosphonates; 3) patients carrying artificial heart valves or artificial joints; 4) patients suffering from periodontal abscesses and fever.

The theme of the conference was the *Landscape of Learning* and included in its title reflection, inter-professional education, assessment and innovation. The group is keen to explore closer links with ADEE and this will be one of the aims of our international activity in the coming year. I also promoted The European Journal of Dental Education highlighting that it now has an attractive Impact Factor which in turn will mean much more work in the future for our esteemed Editor, Michael Manogue!

During our time in Seattle we were pleased to have exchanges with our colleagues from South East Asia Association for

European Parliament roundtable marks World Oral Health Day



BRUSSELS, 5 March 2013 – The Platform for Better Oral Health in Europe unveiled proposed targets for improved oral health and the launch of a Europe-wide consultation on priorities for achieving better oral health by 2020. Ahead of World Oral Health Day 2013, Karen Karenbach MEP hosted a roundtable discussion at the European Parliament where proposed targets were presented to EU policymakers and to a representative panel of public health stakeholders and professional associations.

Mr. Martin Seychell, SANCO Deputy Director-General said the EU has a clear role to play emphasising the ambition of the European Commission to adopt a holistic approach to oral diseases prevention and to addressing major risk factors for oral diseases in an integrated way. Most oral health problems can be prevented and while routine oral hygiene practices are common knowledge people do not put them into practice. He identified three areas where dental public health stakeholders can help the European Institutions to further promote oral health by providing advice on how best to:

1. **Address the communication deficit** and identify the best ways to get the message across, especially within schools and towards the population aged 18-25.
2. **Develop the evidence-base** and improve reporting on oral health at European level by working together to identify top priority European Community Health Indicators (ECHI);
3. **Integrate oral health in the European Joint Action on Chronic Diseases** to identify best practices across Europe and develop common guidance and methods with EU Member States. The focus being on co-morbidity, he welcomed new initiatives such as the Irish Department of Health's pilot project to integrate referral of diabetes patients by GPs to dentists for periodontal disease checkups. In addition, as people live longer, more focus is needed on preventing oral diseases amongst the elderly and on training of care-givers.

Over 40 participants representing dental associations, dental public health experts and members of the European Parliament and European Commission contributed to the session including Professor Kenneth Eaton, Chair of the Platform; Dr Wolfgang Doneus, Council of European Dentists; Dr Georgios Tsakos, European Association of Dental Public Health; Sophie Darteville, Union Française pour la Santé Bucco-Dentaire. Amongst the many items discussed were initiatives such as food taxation. Martin Seychell noted that there are more efficient ways to promote healthy diets and influence behaviours from an early age. Dr Teresa Leisebach, European Association for Paediatric Dentistry, spoke of the need to start dental education pre school going age and Dr Paula Vassallo, Council of European Chief Dental Officers, suggested working with expectant mothers who are the first educators of children. Prof Heikki Murtomaa, ADEE, addressed the need to educate dentists to their new role and competences, stating they have a key responsibility in the prevention of oral disease and the nurturing of a positive oral health lifestyle. Participants discussed the need to invest in proper oral health data collection systems. Dr Nigel Carter, International Dental Health Foundation, and Dr Paula Vassallo both emphasized the importance of basing oral health policy decisions on strong evidence. Development of new national catalogues of competency-based learning objectives for dentistry and medicine in Germany (NKLZ, NKLM)

Medical education in Germany is changing. The Dental Licensure Act, which hasn't been amended since the 50's and the Medical Licensure Act (orders regulating licenses to practise dentistry and medicine) are subject to intense discussion. Important topics *inter alia* are enhancement of interaction between medical and dental education, and incorporation of more medical topics into dental curriculum. The enactment of the new regulations is expected soon.

Competency-oriented graduate profiles will play a key role in the design of the new dental curricula which will then be developed. Therefore, the institutions governing dental and medical education, Society for Medical Education (*Gesellschaft für Medizinische Ausbildung, GMA*), German Association of Medical Faculties (*Medizinischer Fakultätentag MFT*), Association of University Teachers of Dentistry and Oral Medicine (*VHZMK*) and German Society of Dental, Oral and Craniomandibular Sciences (*DGZMK*) are jointly developing national competency-based catalogues of dental and medical learning objectives, entitled *Nationaler Kompetenzbasierter Lernzielkatalog Zahnmedizin NKLZ and Nationaler kompetenzbasierter Lernzielkatalog Medizin NKLM*. These catalogues will include a dental and a medical

core curriculum in order to facilitate curriculum design by the faculties.

For this purpose, NKLZ and NKLM will draw upon the Canadian Can-MEDS framework which was originally designed for postgraduate education

www.royalcollege.ca/public/resources/aboutcanmeds Another important basis for the dental catalogue is the ADEE approved 'Profile and Competences for the Graduating European Dentist' Eur J Dent Edu 2010;14:193–202)

It is intended to prepare dental and medical students for their future medical roles. The future doctor in the role of an expert will utilise dental and medical knowledge, clinical skills and professional attitudes, in conjunction with the expertise of other medical roles, to implement patient-centred care. Synergies between the two projects have already been realised and it is hoped that a first draft of NKLM and NKLZ can be jointly submitted to the medical faculties in 2013. (*GMS Zeitschrift für Medizinische Ausbildung 2012, Vol. 29; Fischer M.*) Then a national consensus process, which will include the Scientific Medical Societies (AWMF), will be undertaken.
